



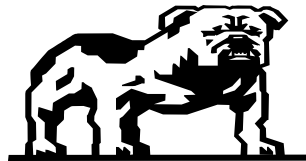
GALVIN MIDDLE SCHOOL CITIZENSHIP NEWSLETTER



Citizen of the Month Program

Starting in March, we will be launching our Citizen of the Month program to recognize some of the finer qualities in our students. It is an integral piece in the development of all our youngsters. Each team will select two students and the “specials” teachers will, as a group, select 1 student per grade. We will also create a bulletin board in the front lobby displaying students’ pictures along with their narrative. At the end of the year, we will plan a breakfast to recognize all the winners from March until the end of the year. Students can only be chosen once per year.
