Academic/ Review PROJECT ACHIEVE July 6-August 6

Canton Academy offers a strong academic program for students who will benefit from review within a small group environment. For students Grades 1-8, all classes last 90 minutes for the full five weeks. Students are encouraged to add a 90 minute creative, enrichment course to supplement the academic classes. In order to ensure that the teacher meets the students' needs, it is advisable to register early so that we can obtain results from the most recent academic assessments. All classes will have a limit of 10 students to maximize individual instruction.

Extended Day Option at the JFK

Canton Academy will offer an extended day option for families who would like their child to have a full day experience. The children will start in the caf by having lunch and each day will be a variety of fun, creative and engaging activities for all. Whether playing outside, in the gym, doing arts and crafts etc, the child will be in a fun and safe environment creating new memories and making new friends.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

■ Acting and Improv—Aimee Delaporta

This class is an acting workshop beginning with theatre games to learn about aspects of pantomime, listening, and speaking. Then we'll move onto improvisation games like those from the TV show "Whose Line is it Anyway?" along with short scenes and skits to improve character development, directing and acting. Both acting skills and self confidence will be improved.

■ All Things Disney Grades 3-6- Kathleen Lam

Each day the first hour will be devoted to watching one Disney movie, we will make crafts with a Disney theme (Mickey ear head bands, gloves etc.). We will also learn how to write our names using the famous Disney font.

■ American Girl Summer Fun Club Grades 1-4-Lori Jerrier

Bring your dolls for a Summer Fun Club filled with games, crafts, and stories. Play Addy's Mancala, Molly's Mystery Game, create a scrapbook for your doll and so much more!

■ Animation- John O'Sullivan

Students will learn how to edit images in Photoshop and turn those images into animations using other software programs. The images will be turned into animated gifs and using Image Ready and animations using Macromedia Flash. How animations work and are designed will be included as part of the workshop.

■ Around The World With Music Grades 3-6 - Jen Tower

In this course, students will experience music from a variety of cultures through songs, dances, games, and instruments. A short performance for family and friends will take place at the end of the week.

■ Back at the Barnyard Adventure Grades 1-4-Lori Jerrier

Looking for some Barn Busting Fun? Join us for Moo-sical Chairs, Egg Toss, and Farmer Says. We will also create barnyard themed crafts.

■ Beginning Scrap Booking- Elba Zayas

This course is designed for the student that would like to learn the basics. Various techniques will be explored and all that is needed are some pictures and a creative mind. (\$10 fee for supplies includes small albums, paper, stickers, and use of tools).

■ CPR/Babysitting- Maryellen McNally

Baby-sitting course with Pediatric CPR certification. Course covers baby care basics, and first aid, as well as how to interview and obtain employment. A \$15.00 materials fee is necessary to cover the cost of books and certification cards.

■ **Creative Writing With a Twist! Grades 2-5- Susie Woodland**

Whether you already adore writing or are just curious about the process, this class will teach you how to get writing started. You will illustrate what you write and express your ideas through drama or art as well as words. You be the reporter! Explore picture prompts from *National Geographic* magazines and tell us vividly what it is, where it is, what happened and why! Take us there with your colorful writing. Everyone will participate in writing hilarious “What If..?” stories that will be compiled and published into a funny book. “What If..?” topics include, “What if children were the parents?”, “What if insects were as big as people?”, What if the ocean was made out of jelly?” Come add to the list!

■ **Desktop Publishing using Publisher and MS Word- John O’Sullivan**

Individuals taking this class will learn how to create a newsletter, greeting cards and a brochure. Students will learn basic layout and design as well as a better understanding of graphics. Students will learn how to better use the computer for printing home made publications.

■ **Dreamweaver and HTML- John O’Sullivan**

Students will learn how to edit and use basic HTML within a webpage. Students will build webpages in Macromedia Dreamweaver. Basic website design and layout will be discussed. By the end of the class students will be able to make a basic website and have a greater understanding of how the World Wide Web works.

■ **Drama Camp Grades 4-8- Rebecca Smart**

Drama Camp is for students who LOVE to act! If you enjoy being on stage, you will love summer Drama Camp. Students entering grades 4-8 are eligible. During the day, campers will improve their acting skills through role-play, improv, costume making, scenery building and drama games. At the end of the week, the students will put on a production for family and friends! Join the fun and sign up today!

■ **Exploring Nature Grades 1-5- Teri Bartlett**

In this program we will explore nature and the environment through experiments, games, crafts and hands-on activities. We’ll focus on plants, animals, insects and nature conservation.

■ **Extra! Extra! Read All About It! Grades 2-5- Susie Woodland**

Attention writers and artists! Help create Canton Academy’s 2009 Newspaper! Learn about parts of a newspaper and different types of print. Come write captions, editorials, horoscopes, local news, classifieds, advertisements, and draw cartoons! Describe the headline news, sport events, animal stories, and even interview people. Put your writing and computer skills to work. Help make summer news!

■ **Fizzy Foam Science Grades 1-5-Lori Jerrier**

You will conduct science experiments that your parents won’t let you do at home! Get ready to get messy and learn about science.

■ **Get in the Garden!- Elisa Blanchard**

Students learn by doing in this hands-on vegetable gardening course. We study the importance of sun, soil, pollination, and water to growth. Food for thought, potting plants, and green beans to eat!

■ **Handcraft Grades 3-6- Kathleen Lam**

The possibilities are endless when you work with your hands. Origami and beading will be the main crafts but we will also explore paper cutting and even cooking. Anything that your hands can do we will do it!

■ **Hip Hop—Aimee Delaporta**

A high energy class set to hip-hop and Top 40 dance music. Coordination, style, musicality, strength and stamina is emphasized in Hip Hop. Class consists of flexibility and strengthening exercises, cardio exercises, short dance combinations and introduction to improvisation.

■ **International Adventures Grades 1-5- Terri Bartlett**

Come Travel the world with us! Learn about different countries and cultures through games, crafts, stories and a taste of some traditional cuisine. All aboard Bartlett Airlines!

■ **Introduction to Origami Grades 2-5-Lori Jerrier**

Jumping frogs, a Family of Foxes, and Soaring Airplanes are some of the projects children will create with Origami (the art of paper folding).

■ **KidzArt:**

■ **Life on the Oregon Trail Grades 2-5-Lori Jerrier**

■ **Move Over, Mozart!- Grades 4-8 Jen Tower**

In this course, students will use a step-by-step process to compose their own music! We will compose for voice, Orff instruments, and recorder. A short performance of student work will take place at the end of the week.

■ **Music and Movement Grades 1-3- Jen Tower**

In this course, students will explore music with singing games, dances, instrument playing, and story telling. Please wear comfortable sneakers and be ready to move!

■ **Orienteering-”The Amazing Race” Grades 4-8-Rob Bartlett**

Orienteering is an outdoor activity where people race using maps to find hidden points around a set course. It’s like racing to find a hidden treasure. In this course, we will be learning about mapping skills, making our own maps and of course racing. As your mapping skills improve, so will your racing. It’s a combination of brains and speed. Just like on Amazing Race, there will be challenges and pitstops along the way for your team to complete before you can carry on with the race. Do you think you could win the Amazing Race?

■ **Photoshop- John O’Sullivan**

Students will learn how to edit digital photographs and create artwork in Photoshop. Students will take pictures and alter the pictures using different tools. Students will learn how to use several tools to create numerous effects. By the end of the class students will have a better understanding of how photographs and graphics are edited.

■ **STOMP! Grades 4-8 Jen Tower**

Got junk? Instead of filling landfills, let’s use it to make music! In this course we will use everyday objects such as buckets, balls, brooms, and our bodies in musical ways. A short performance for family and friends will take place at the end of the week.

■ **Team and Recreational Games- Kevin Ward/ Kori White/ Ali Canney/Antonia Sims**

Through cooperation, children will participate in many different fun and exciting games, activities, and challenges. Do you dare take this adventure? Join us and find out! A lot of outdoor games AND LOTS OF FUN!

■ **The Book Bag Grades 1-3- Kim Willett**

Children will have an opportunity to listen to some of the newest titles in childrens literature. From princesses to pirates, children will have an opportunity to meet the most engaging characters. Each Read Aloud will be followed by a craft or other engaging follow-up activity.

■ **The Gingerbread Man-Andrea Widberg**

Mrs. Widberg’s favorite story is the Gingerbread Man. In this course, children will listen to these books, create gingerbread characters - paper and real cookies, measure GB men, learn how to draw, decorate, paint and color GB men. Students will create GB puppets, make patterns graph and chart story elements and as a culminating experience make gingerbread houses.

■ **TV Production—Edward McDonough**

Learn video camera basics and produce a group video that will air on our local cable channel. Students must be willing to be seen on our local affiliate Canton Community Television.

■ **Understanding Multiplication Grades 2-4- Pat Phalan**

This course uses games and group work to help students understand the concept of multiplication (equal sets and equal shares). It also uses technology to show kids several math sites whose functions are to review and reinforce multiplication facts.

■ **Under the Sea Adventure Grades 1-4- Lori Jerrier**

Play Dolphin Ring Toss, Fishing Game, and Pin The Tail on the Shark-Yikes! Create ocean themed crafts and earn Sand Dollars to spend in our Sea Shell Shop.

■ **Wrestling 101 Grades 5-8 - Leo Nelson**

This class is designed for teaching the fundamentals of wrestling. The classes will focus on wrestling techniques, positive attitude, mental and physical conditioning and the will to succeed that makes a champion wrestler. There will be live wrestling and games played during each session.
