Academic/ Review PROJECT ACHIEVE July 6-August 6

Canton Academy offers a strong academic program for students who will benefit from review within a small group environment. For students Grades 1-8, all classes last 90 minutes for the full five weeks. Students are encouraged to add a 90 minute creative, enrichment course to supplement the academic classes. In order to ensure that the teacher meets the students' needs, it is advisable to register early so that we can obtain results from the most recent academic assessments. All classes will have a limit of 10 students to maximize individual instruction.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

■ All Star Sports- Lori Jerrier Grades K-4

Tennis anyone? Try playing with flyswatters and balloons! We will have interesting variations of sports that anyone can play. In addition, you will learn new songs and make crafts.

■ Awesome Animal Art 1 & 11- Ann Daniele Grades 2-6

Do you love animals? In this course we'll have fun making art projects that have to do with your favorite animals! You don't have to take Animal Art 1 to take animal art 11!

■ Back at the Barnyard Adventure-Lori Jerrier Grades K-4

Looking for some Barn Busting Fun? Join us for Moo-sical Chairs, Egg Toss, and Farmer Says. We will also create barnyard themed crafts.

■ Beach Art 1 & 11- Ann Daniele Grades 2-6

Beach lovers will explore different materials to create art/craft projects having to do with the beach and its inhabitants. You do not have to take Beach Art 1 to take Beach Art 11!

■ Cardio Kickboxing- Alisa Primavera Grades 5-8

Students would begin the class with a series of warm ups and stretches. Students would then be taught the basic martial arts kicks and punches, and combinations of the two. All kicks and punches will be done on pads and heavy bags. No physical contact. This class will be taught on the basis of peace and self improvement, not competition between one another.

■ CPR/Babysitting- Maryellen McNally Grades 5-8

Baby-sitting course with Pediatric CPR certification. Course covers baby care basics, and first aid, as well as how to interview and obtain employment. A \$15.00 materials fee is necessary to cover the cost of books and certification cards.

■ Jump Rope, Double Dutch and Fitness- Alisa Primavera All Grade Levels

Students begin the class with a series of warm ups and stretches. They would then practice individual jump rope skills. After that, students will come together to practice team jump roping. Jump roping will be learned in steps, each child at their own pace. The ultimate goal will be for students to learn how to jump double dutch.

■ Drama Camp- Yan Yii Grades 3-7

The students will focus on writing a short fairy tale play, assign characters, and play improvisational theatre games. They will focus on acting, rehearsing, and possibly adding song and dance. There will be a play performance at the end of the week.

Extended Day Option at the Luce

Canton Academy will offer an extended day option for families who would like their child to have a full day experience. The children will start in the caf by having lunch and each day will be a variety of fun, creative and engaging activities for all. Whether playing outside, in the gym, doing arts and crafts etc, the child will be in a fun and safe environment creating new memories and making new friends.

■ **Everything Bubbles- Jessica Lloyd Grades 3-6**

Have you ever wondered why bubbles are round, which bubble gum blows the biggest bubbles, or how to make your own bubble solution? If so, come explore the fascinating world of bubble-ology by taking this course!

■ **Friendship Club- Lori Jerrier Grades K-4**

Grab some friends and join the fun! You will make crafts, sing songs and play games. What a great way to spend the day with your BFF.

■ **Fun with Food and Play- Elaine Thornton Grades 3-6**

This program is all about learning fun ways to make healthy choices. Want to learn how to make delicious smoothies less than 5 minutes? Try your hand at making some food from another country? The second part of the course will be fun activity. Through fun interactive games participants will realize that exercise can be fun! There is no skill required, it's all about learning to live a happier lifestyle.

■ **Hip Hop Dance- Alisa Primavera Grades 5-8**

Students would begin the class with a series of warm ups and stretches. Students will have a chance to show their best dance moves. The final dances will be a compilation of the student's favorite moves, and others taught by the teacher.

■ **Knitting, Cross-Stitch, and Needlepoint- Linda Nash Grades 5-8**

Beginners will be taught basic stitches and techniques, create a practice piece and start a small project. Advanced students will either bring a project from home or select a new project to work on. They will learn more advanced stitches and techniques.

■ **Making Waves- Jessica Lloyd Grades 3-6**

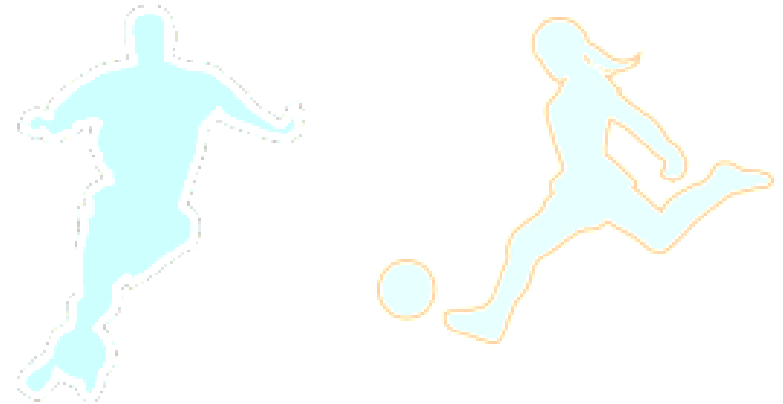
Explore the science behind light and sound waves through experiments, activities, and demonstrations. Students will have fun watching a solar bag take flight and experimenting with solar mitts. They will learn about ultraviolet light, white light, and how to bend light. They will also create hummer bees, musical bottles, and other forms of sound.

■ **Orienteering-"The Amazing Race"-Rob Bartlett Grades 4-8**

Orienteering is an outdoor activity where people race using maps to find hidden points around a set course. It's like racing to find a hidden treasure. In this course, we will be learning about mapping skills, making our own maps and of course racing. As your mapping skills improve, so will your racing. It's a combination of brains and speed. Just like on Amazing Race, there will be challenges and pitstops along the way for your team to complete before you can carry on with the race. Do you think you could win the Amazing Race?

■ **Rocket and Roll- Jessica Lloyd Grades 3-6**

Have a blast discovering the world of motion and gravity by conducting hands on experiments and building models. Students will have fun launching balloon and bottle rockets, building elastic powered cars, and much more!



■ **Scavenger Hunts, Secret Codes and Perplexing Puzzles- Chris Untersee Grades 4-8**

We will make our own fun, working together and challenging each other with scavenger hunts, creating our own secret codes and messages and learning how to use what we already know to solve logic and math puzzles such as kenken and sudoku! While we will explore a variety of activities together, children will also have time to delve deeper into activities that spark their interest. When this course is finished, each child will have a great collection of ways to fight the “I’m bored!” days of summer!

■ **Softball Camp-Danielle McNamara Grades 4-8**

Are you interested in learning the game of softball? Are you looking to improve your skills? Join Coach Danielle McNamara and some of the CHS varsity players for a week of learning and improving the basic softball skills of throwing, catching, fielding, hitting, and pitching.

■ **Sports and Games- Kerin Carta Grades 3-6**

Come join your friends and play all of your favorite sports and games. Have fun playing games like dodgeball, kickball, capture the flag, wiffleball, basketball and lots more!

■ **Scrapbooking- Kerin Carta (Week Two) Linda Nash (Week Five) Grades 4-8**

Students will learn elements of scrapbook design and create a scrapbook. They will bring pictures from home to make a scrapbook.

■ **Summer Crafts- Linda Nash Grades 3-7**

Following a theme of summer activities students will create a different craft project each day. Monday they will customize and create a stained glass decoration. Tuesday students will design and create a friendship bracelet. Wednesday they will design and create a picture frame. Thursday students will design and customize a flower pot.

■ **Survivor I & II Grades 2-6**

■ **Under the Sea Adventure- Lori Jerrier Grades K-4**

Play Dolphin Ring Toss, Fishing Game, and Pin The Tail on the Shark-Yikes! Create ocean themed crafts and earn Sand Dollars to spend in our Sea Shell Shop.

■ **Under the Big Top- Lori Jerrier Grades K-4**

Fun for boys and girls of all ages! Try juggling, walking on a “tightrope” and Pin the Nose on the Clown. You will learn circus themed songs, games and create crafts.!

■ **Wet and Wild Weather- Jessica Lloyd Grades 3-6**

Students will have fun exploring the wild world of meteorology through experiments, demonstrations, and activities. If you want to create a cloud, make weather instruments, or simulate a tornado, then this is the course for you!
