


Keeping Up with the Kennedy



Students moved around to six different stations where they had to read 5 statements and color the corresponding section of their wheel. If they agreed with the statement or did it 100% of the time they colored it, but if they didn't do it very often it would have less color. The more color, the healthier they were in that area.



Students attending the ½ day program at Metro South rotated through obstacle courses including bars, beam, vault, and floor. Kids were able to try out new skills such as a kick over on the bars or dismount off of the beam. Following the rotations, they were given choice time where they could play on the equipment of their choice or even give rope climbing a try.



Students in Mrs. Booth's 5th Grade were estimating quotients and using graphing to discover the different amounts of fresh water and salt water on Earth.



Kindergarten students in Ms. Di Mascio's class did a pumpkin investigation. First they made careful observation drawings of the pumpkin in their science notebooks. They noticed that the pumpkin was orange, bumpy, hard, and indented. They measured the pumpkin using blocks. The pumpkin was 20 blocks tall. Then they walked down to the nurse's office to see how much the pumpkin weighed. It was 9.5 lbs!

Regardless of how you send in your BoxTops, please make sure to include your child's Name, Grade, Room and Teacher on the label or sheet.


For every 25 BOXTOPS submitted, students earn one (1) entry into a per grade raffle!



