G. New Business:

1. CHS and GMS Program of Studies: Dr. Chamberland, Mr. Sperling, Ms. Shannon, Dr. Green and Mr. Spillane presented the CHS and GMS Program of Studies. Dr. Chamberland and Principal Sperling highlighted changes. Some examples of CHS changes include the reorganization of the mathematics department scope and sequence, course names changes to more accurately reflect the learning that takes place in the courses, more detailed information about the level of language acquisition throughout French, German, and Spanish, change of the letter "E" to the letter "F" to align with middle school and common secondary school practice and others. Ms. Moran asked that the document be made available in a hard copy/pdf format for families and the Committee to be able to compare and monitor changes in courses offered from previous years. Members requested that the information be shared in different ways for families to be able to access and view the information within the Google Site and off of the site.

Ms. Shannon reviewed the GMS changes which included the reorganization of the Mathematics Department scope and sequence, revised course names, World Language included more detailed information about the level of language acquisition for French and Spanish and added a newly developed course, an added Student Services section, updates to the resources used in English and Reading, updated Social Studies curriculum and standards based on the recent, frameworks changes the removed sections that were out of date and no longer applicable (study skills, appendices, etc) and the re-alignment of the Technology & Engineering courses. Like the CHS POS, there was a request for a pdf format for families and the school committee to view and track all changes. There was also a request to share/link the DESE frameworks summary page on the google site.

- 3. <u>COVID-19 Updates</u>: Mr. Folan shared COVID-19 vaccination updates. CHS is currently at 78% vaccination rate for students and staff. At home antigen tests were handed out to students today. The next distribution is in two weeks. This is an opt-in program. DESE released new protocols, CPS Nursing is reviewing those minor changes and will be brought forward to the policy subcommittee meeting for initial review.
- 4. <u>GMS Make-Up Days</u>: Mr. Folan discussed options pertaining to plans to make up the two required GMS school days. The first suggestion is to make the March 11 full PD day a ½ day for GMS for students to make up on that day. The second day will require additional work. Staff and families will be asked for feedback via a survey regarding the 2nd makeup day.

5. <u>Interim Superintendent Formative Assessment</u>: Mr. Folan reported on the progress made on District goals and Superintendent goals. School Committee members offered their feedback and discussed progress. Communication was acknowledged as a strong suit. Some feedback included the need to develop a plan to diversify staff, continued transparency around actions and discussions, continue to explore an equity audit and hold a workshop in the near future, the need for continued focus on attention to academic rigor and continuum in learning across all schools, a request to promote and build on climate change and sustainability options as a District. The formal summative assessment will take place in May.
